If you are new to our church, you may not be familiar with the Anglican liturgy. But as you follow along in the bulletin it will guide you through the service. We encourage you to participate in as much or as little of the service as you feel comfortable.

We do celebrate communion in our services, and we invite all those who have been baptized and are committed to following Christ to join us, regardless of denomination. There are directions explaining how we partake of communion in the bulletin at that point in the service, and a leader will further explain these directions at that time as well.

Children's Ministry is available at each of our Sunday services.

At 9 AM, Children age 3 - 3rd grade begin in the service and then are dismissed to our 2 classrooms: Preschool (age 3-5) and Godly Play (Kinder- 3rd grade) with prayer after the collect.

At 10:45 AM, Children age 3-6th grade head to their classes similarily, with the addition of our 2-3rd grade class upstairs and 4-6th grade class downstairs. PreK parents please come up to reconnect with your littles after the Peace, others will be dismissed from their classes to the sanctuary.

Nursery care is available at both services for children under 3. During the announcements, please pick up infants and toddlers from the nursery, and preschool children from their class. Older children will be brought to the Sanctuary at that time.

If you have questions or need more information please let us know--you can ask a greeter or anyone else you see serving today to help you, or you may contact us using the contact information provided on the back of the bulletin.
